


Dean of Graduate Studies

Information-Gathering Phase


Questions:


Questionnaire Results

- Twenty-nine responses
- Five indicated they do accept ETDs
- Many provided details of plans and issues being investigated
- All but five indicated they are considering accepting and providing access to ETDs

Pilot Project Proposal

- To determine the feasibility of electronic distribution of theses
 - select twenty test theses, including text-only as well as theses with non-traditional components.
 - convert the theses into the distribution formats to be tested
 - provide campus-wide Web access to the test theses
